CHALLENGES

The program will address the main challenges of long-term care at home, such as:

- problems with funding,
- poor accessibility to medical, social, psychological and support services (e.g. food delivery, shopping, physiotherapy, education) necessary for quality living,
- uncoordinated care with neglect of psychosocial aspects, the consequences of which include loneliness and social isolation.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Lectures and workshops

nursing and physiotherapy education, economic, social and technological aspects of home care for the elderly, familiarizing students with the basics of long-term home care, legal framework, holistic and integrated health care (nursing and physiotherapy) and social care at home, economic and technological aspects of home care and examples of best practices from different countries.

Project work

formation of international interdisciplinary teams (the team consists of five students: nursing, physiotherapy, social work, economics and engineering students) for project work to be carried out virtually
